DAY 1: MONDAY, APRIL 5

- 11:00am Call time in Band Room, Luggage and Instruments loaded on truck; Pick up Name Tags upon arrival in Band Room
- 12:00pm District Buses and Trucks depart for Los Angeles International/Northwest Airlines
- 1:00pm Arrival at Los Angeles International/Northwest Airlines; check-in for Northwest Airlines Flight 2123 for Honolulu, Hawaii

- Meet your On Trek trip leaders Stevyn Polk and Richard Sprankling in the Baggage Claim Area
- Transfer to hotel; check-in to the Hilton Hawaiian Village; portage included for bags to be taken to the rooms; group orientation

- Evening to explore the 22 acre grounds of the fabulous Hilton Hawaiian Village or walk over to the **International Marketplace** with over 130 carts, shops and artisan stands, this open-air setting in the heart of Waikiki remains a must-see-and-do for that special gift or souvenir

DAY 2: TUESDAY, APRIL 6

- 7:00am Wake Up
- Walk to have Breakfast at International House of Pancakes included
- Free time until 11:45am when picked up by buses and transported to the University of Hawaii.
- Music clinic at the University of Hawaii*; clinician Grant Okamura will work with the band on various aspects of their performance, including posture and breathing, emboshure, sight-reading, historical context, quiding them through self-evaluation of their performance
- Learn about King Kamehameha's decisive battle to unite the islands at Nu'uanu Pali Lookout
- Transfer to Ala Moana Shopping Center
- ✓ John F. Kennedy High School Band: afternoon performance at Oahu's premier site, Ala Moana's Center Stage from 4:00pm-4:45pm.* Ala Moana Shopping Center is Hawaii's largest shopping mecca, with an indoor performing stage that annually hosts thousands of performers, guaranteeing a daily audience of up to 400 or more spectators.
- Dinner at Bubba Gump's included
- Buses will pick the group up after dinner. Take rented instruments back to the University of Hawaii.

DAY 3: WEDNESDAY, APRIL 7

- 6:00am Wake Up
- Breakfast at Wailana's Coffee House- included
- Learn about a pivotal moment in American history when you visit the **U.S.S. Arizona Memorial at Pearl Harbor, commemorating** all military personnel killed in the Pearl Harbor attack. This is "ground zero" where World War II began for the United States; the event where Admiral Isoroku Yamamoto stated: "I fear all we have done is to awaken a sleeping giant..."

- 9:15am 2nd Group Tour
- Lunch on own
- Find Hawaii's best buys at **Aloha Flea Market**, the home of football's Pro Bowl. Aloha Stadium Swap Meet has become Hawaii's premier outdoor market, featuring over 700 vendors, crafters, artists from all over the world, a true melting pot of Aloha
- Driving tour of Honolulu:
 - The Hawaii State Capitol's distinct architectural features are representative of the unique history and natural features of the Islands. The entire building is set in a reflecting pool symbolizing the rise of the Hawaiian Islands from the sea. The conic shape of the legislative chambers represents the **volcanoes** that spawned the geological origins of the Islands, and the 40 pillars encircling the building suggest an image of coconut palm trees, which were a major

- source of food, water, building materials and other necessities for early Hawaiians.
- The most prominent monument on the statehouse grounds is the Father Damien Statue, a tribute to the Hawaii Catholic Church priest who died in 1869 after sixteen years of serving patients afflicted with leprosy on the Molokai peninsula of Kalapapa
- 'Iolani Palace is the only royal palace used as an official residence by a reigning monarch in the United States and is a National Historic Landmark. Two monarchs governed from 'Iolani Palace: King David Kalakaua and Queen Lili'uokalani. After the monarchy was overthrown in 1893, the building was used as the capitol building for the Provisional Government, Republic, Territory, and State of Hawaii until 1969. The palace was opened to the public as a museum in 1978.
- Statue of King Kamehameha
- Kawaiaha'o Church and Mission Houses: Kawaiaha'o Church was built of 14,000 slabs of coral rock quarried from an offshore reef on Oahu. Hawaiian Divers with hand tools dived 3 to 6 metres below sea-level to chisel out each coral block, which had to then be transported from the reef onto the shore. Known as the Westminster Abbey of Hawaii, it was the official site for royal coronations, christenings and funerals. The adjacent Mission Houses represent Hawaii's "Missionary Period" from about 1820 to 1863, housing historical collections and artifacts of the New England missionaries that actively worked to bring Congregational Christianity to the Sandwich Islands.

Day 4: THURSDAY, APRIL 8

- 8:00am Wake Up
- Breakfast at International House of Pancakes included
- Spend the remainder of the afternoon enjoying structured activities: choices range from visiting the Waikiki Aquarium or Honolulu Zoo, or surfing lessons (trip leader will assist you to organize these)
- Chinese dinner at **PF Changs** in Royal Hawaiian Shopping Center included

Day 5: FRIDAY, APRIL 9

- 8:00am Wake Up
- Breakfast at Wailana's Coffee House- included
- This day is free until 3:30pm for activity of your choice (not included in price): snorkel at Hanauma Bay, hike Diamond Head crater, outrigger canoeing and swimming or just fun in the sun on Waikiki Beach!
- Re in hotel lobby at 3:30pm for Paradise Cove bus pick up
- Enjoy an **authentic Hawaiian luau at Paradise Cove** on the leeward beaches of Oahu; experience an Imu Ceremony, hula dancing, and all-you-can-eat buffet dinner. Try your hand at traditional arts and crafts, plus take part in unique games of Hawaii. Guests can take part in a traditional *hukilau*, pulling giant fishing nets from the sea to the rhythms of a conch shell and island chants. Follow the Royal Court in a sunset ceremony to unearth the luau's traditional underground-roasted pig. Then, enjoy your luau feast and one of Polynesia's greatest fire knife-dancers and hula dancers in an incomparable setting under the stars in a wonderful Hawaiian night.

Check-In Baggage

- We are requesting each traveler bring no more than **One Suitcase**
- Northwest baggage fees \$25.00 for 1st bag and \$35.00 for 2nd bag. Baggage fees are covered in the trip cost for one suitcase as the 1st bag and checked in instruments for the 2nd bag. Envelopes with the exact cash will be provided for each traveler for their 1st bag and 2nd bag for students with check in instruments at LAX and Honolulu Airport. Each traveler will pay their baggage fees at the airline counter.
- The limit on Northwest for baggage is 50 pounds and 62 linear inches. Any baggage from 51 -70 pounds will incur a \$90.00 penalty. Any baggage from 63 to 80 linear inches will incur a \$175 penalty. Penalties are not included in the trip cost. It will be each traveler's responsibility to pay if they exceed the limits.

Approved Personal Carry-on Items

- 1 purse, briefcase, camera bag, or diaper bag;
- or 1 laptop computer (computers cannot be checked and must be carried on);
- **or** 1 item of a similar or smaller size to those listed above.
- All carry-on items must be easily stored in the overhead bin or under the seat in front of you.

Additional Approved Carry-on Items

A couple of other items are okay to bring onboard. **They do not count toward your personal items.** Keep reading. To be prepared for any kind of weather, you may bring a coat, jacket, or umbrella. Enjoy food or drink purchased after clearing the security checkpoint. Go ahead and shop. One box or bag of duty free merchandise is allowed.

Carry-on Items: Baggage Size and Weight Restrictions

When oversized bags don't fit in the overhead bins, delays happen. Fees will also be applied to the oversized bag if it has to be checked. In order to avoid delays as well as fees, follow these size and weight requirements:

Baggage may not exceed 45 linear inches (length+width+height) or 115 cm. Baggage must fit easily in our SizeCheck® unit (approximately 22"x14"x9" or 56x36x23 cm). Fees apply if your bag is too large to carry on and has to be checked at the gate.

Transportation

- Anaheim Union High School District Buses and Trucks will be utilized to transport all travelers, suitcases and instruments from Kennedy to Los Angeles International Airport on April 5th and also for our return on April 11th from Los Angeles International Airport to Kennedy.
- We strongly recommend that no one leaves their vehicle in the school parking lot while we are on the 6-day trip. Please make arrangements to be dropped off and picked up in Kennedy's Parking Lot.
- The Hawaiian Shirt is our travel shirt. So please wear it on Monday April 5 when we depart and on Saturday April 10 when we return. Also, the students are required to wear the Hawaiian Shirt on Tuesday, April 6 for the Music Clinic at the University of Hawaii and the afternoon performance at Ala Moana's Center Stage.
